Essay Writing

An essay is generally a short piece of writing outlining the writer's perspective. It is considered synonymous with a paper or an article. Essays can be formal as well as informal

Formal essays are generally academic in nature and tackle serious topics. Informal essays are personal or humorous. Narrative Essays narrate a story or an incident. Descriptive essays describe a place, an event or an object. Expository essays give a balanced view of the topic. Persuasive essays persuade the reader to accept the point of view expressed in an essay.

Format of an Essay

There is no rigid format to write an essay since "it is a loose sally of the mind" as said

by the writer, Dr. Johnson. It is a creative process. However, there is a basic structure that is generally followed while writing essays.

Introduction

This is the first paragraph of an essay. This is where the writer introduces his topic.

It gives a very brief synopsis of your essay. Generally, it is not very long and consists of about 4-6 lines.

The quotations by famous personalities or raising a question tempts the people to read an essay. They give a good start. "Good beginning makes a good end". "Well begun is half won" Body

This is the main crux of your essays and the most vital and important content of the essay will be here. It can extend to two or more paragraphs according to the content or information that a person has. The information has to be arranged properly. It should have coherence. It should not be written un organised or in a haphazard manner because it may leave the reader confused. It is important to organize and prioritize points. Write the information in a systematic flow so that the reader can comprehend. So, for example, when

narrating an incident, it is better to do it in a chronological order.

Conclusion

This is the last paragraph of the essay. Sometimes a conclusion will just mirror the

introductory paragraph but make sure the words and syntax are different. A conclusion

is also a great place to sum up a story or an argument. You can round up your essay providing some moral or wrapping up a story. Make sure you complete your essays with conclusion, leave no hanging threads.

Tips for Writing Essays

Give your essays an interesting, catchy ad appropriate title.

Keep the length of the essay between 300-500 words

Keep your language simple and crisp.

Do not make grammar mistakes.

Use correct punctuation and spelling.

Brainstorm the points.

Write all points or information what you know about the topic

Enumerate the points according to their significance.

Add quotations or sayings by experts in the specific field.

Before beginning the essay, organize your thought and plan a draft

Start a new paragraph when a sequence of thought changes towards different

information.

Preparing a rough draft and refining into a better essay in fair draft gives us an interesting essay.
